James G. P. Rasnick was born in 1826 at Tennessee. He married Susannah Felicia Farmer, daughter of David M. Farmer and Rebecca Howard, on 18 Feb 1849 at Laurel Co., Ky. He died on 29 Sep 1890 at Missouri. James was injured in a wagon accident on his way to church in the fall of 1890 and died Courtious, Mo. from a broken back.

He began military service on 30 Jul 1862 James enlisted at Caledonia, Mo. in Co. I (or possibly Co. J), 32nd Mo. Infantry, Union Army 30 Jul 1862 till 11 May 186?; discharged for "kidney trouble caused by exposure." [Correct data is needed for James' military record.]

Reconnaissance to Salkehatchie River January 25. Hickory Hill February 1. Salkehatchie Swamps, S.C., February 2-5. South Edisto River February 9. North Edisto River February 12-13. Columbia February 15-17. Lynch's Creek February 25-26. Battle of Bentonville, N. C., March 20-21. Occupation of Goldsboro March 24. Advance on Raleigh April 10-14. Occupation of Raleigh April 14. Bennett's House April 26. Surrender of Johnston and his army. March to Washington, D.C., via Richmond, Va., April 29-May 20. Grand Review May 24. Moved to Louisville, Ky., June. Redesignated 32nd Regiment Missouri Infantry June 20. Mustered out July 18, 1865. Regiment lost during service 20 Enlisted men killed and mortally wounded and 6 Officers and 408 Enlisted men by disease. Total 434.
